Objectives and Mission

Culture Unlimited Foundation promotes intercultural dialogue and social cohesion through music and cultural projects. The Culture Unlimited Festival focuses on new or rarely heard music — especially from the Eastern world — presented alongside contemporary Western repertoires. Local community participation is central to the programme, which spans contemporary classical, jazz, pop, electronic, and Eastern folk traditions.

Stichting Culture Unlimited - Activity Report 2019

In 2019, Stichting Culture Unlimited organized the **first edition of the Culture Unlimited Festival**, held from **3 November – 20 December** in **Amsterdam, Brussels, Haarlem, Leiden, Rotterdam, The Hague, and Utrecht**.

Theme: *Water* – symbolizing collaboration, cultural exchange, inspiration, and communication.

Activities

- **15 concerts** across 7 cities (Netherlands & Belgium).
- Performances by leading ensembles and artists, including New European
 Ensemble, Tony Overwater Ensemble, Under the Surface, JIP Kamerkoor,
 Consorte Vocaal Ensemble, Choir August 38th, Khaled Alhafez, Oene van Geel,
 Sanne Rambags, Maya Fridman, Rembrandt Frerichs, Trio Saye Roshan,
 among others.
- Presentation of works by Syrian composers (Kinan Abou-Afach, Wassim Ibrahim, Kareem Roustom) and Dutch composers (Rembrandt Frerichs, Jonas Bisquert, Jeroen van Vliet, Kaveh Vares).
- Cross-disciplinary collaborations combining music, literature, and poetry in cooperation with De Gids magazine.

Workshops & Conferences

- **Workshops** with Codarts and Royal Conservatory students.
- The Hague Hacks conference on climate change, tech, and human rights.
- **Interfaith conference** on gender, religion, and human rights (ISS, The Hague).
- Film screenings & talks in Brussels with Cinemaximiliaan and Lagrange Points.

Partnerships

- Collaborations with Gaudeamus Muziekweek, Codarts, Grounds, Verhalenhuis Belvedere, The New Regentes, Donemus, Cinemaximiliaan, Lagrange Points, Rotterdam Arab Film Festival, among others.

Audience & Impact

- **Total attendance:** 1,171 visitors.
- Sold-out events in Utrecht & Haarlem, strong attendance in Rotterdam, The Hague & Brussels.

- Mixed audiences: Dutch, international, and migrant communities (Syrian, Turkish, Iranian).
- **Online reach:** 19,000 via Facebook, 20,000 via partners, and concerts streamed/archived online.
